Will of Joseph Poulton (1792-1834)

This is the Last Will and Testament of Mr Joseph Poulton of No 4 Packers Court Coleman Street in the City of London and of Hackney in the County of Middlesex Tea dealer and Grocer I give devise and bequeath all and every of my freehold and leasehold messuages lands tenements and hereditaments whatsoever and wheresoever either in possession reversion remainder or expectancy with their and every of their appurts unto my beloved wife Sarah Poulton her heirs and assigns for ever I also give and bequeath unto my said wife Sarah Poulton all other my stock in trade furniture and effects life Insurance Policies money and security for money book debts and all other my estate and effects of whatsoever kind and wheresoever to her and her assigns and I hereby constitute and appoint my kind relatives James Poulton Timber merchant Maidenhead and W^m Tozer Oilman of Hackney and Henry Langton Esq^r of Southgate Middlesex executors of this my Will authorizing them to collect all my debts to repay all my funeral and other expenses and to reimburse themselves all expenses incurred in the execution of the same In Witness whereof I the said Joseph Poulton the Testator have to the first page of this set of paper set my hand and to this third page thereof set my hand and seal this twenty fourth day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty four Joseph Poulton LS Signed sealed published and delivered by the said Testator Joseph Poulton as & for his last Will and Testament in the presence of us who at his request in his presence and in the presence of each other have subscribed our names as Witnesses attesting the due execution hereof / Alexander Field Maidenhead Berks Gentleman / Robert Johnson Maidenhead Berks Woollen Draper / John Wakerill Maidenhead Berks (unable to decipher occupation) //

Proved at London the 27th June 1834 before the Worshipful Joseph Phillmore Doctor of Laws and Surrogate by the oath of James Poulton the brother and William Tozer two of the executors to whom admon was granted having been first sworn only to administer power reserved of making the like grant to Henry Langton Esquire the other executor whom he shall apply for the same //
